# Life Changing Programs

Since our beginning, MITS has believed in the importance of evaluation and adaptation to operate in ways that best serve teenagers from the streets. While the details of our programs have changed over time, we have always seen the value in relationships, mental health, and education.



## OUTREACH AND RELATIONSHIP BUILDING

Our Eastleigh Centre provides dedicated, daily programs for boys, girls, mothers and babies living on the streets. In 2023, thousands of teenagers and mothers came to receive love and support through feeding programs, first aid, and caring relationships.



COUNSELING AND SPIRITUAL FORMATION

After living on the streets, MITS students have faced rejection, trauma and lack of self worth. We have dedicated programs for individual and group counseling. Through Bible classes, and mentoring we focus on helping our students find their identity in Christ and know the love of God.



EDUCATION AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING

MITS provides education and vocational training to homeless youth. After joining our boarding school program, we equip the students with skills that will enable them to secure jobs and become selfsufficient after graduation.

# Obed Buys a Bike

Obed is 15 years old. He likes to be busy, and he loves spending his free time making crafts. He particularly enjoys building intricate cardboard creations, taking care to get the details just right. Obed is also a student at MITS. Within that creative mind of his is also a brain for business. Before coming to MITS 3 years ago, when he was living on the streets, Obed met a man one day and borrowed 500 shillings from him. Instead of spending that money on an immediate meal, he decided to buy sweets and sell them for a profit. Soon his 500 shillings became 1,500 shillings, which then became 3,000 shillings. He thought about what he wanted to do with his earnings, and after saving up 10,000 shillings, Obed bought a bike. He rode his bike around the city selling sweets until the day he met someone who set him on a new course. This person asked if he would like to leave his life on the streets and go to school. Obed said, "yes." His bike was a nice mode of transportation and brought him to good business, but it also brought him to MITS. He says when he graduates he wants to help other children living on the streets like he was and would ultimately like to open his own school.

### HOME TEAM


Home Team is the MITS giving club, made up of recurring donors committed to consistently championing the cause. In 2023, Home Team members raised 14% of our total donations.

### VOLUNTEERS





# TOTAL ANNUAL GIVING


In fiscal year 2023, total giving to MITS was \$1,063,000.
